Children at Stairway are in a journey of establishing harmonious relations with the world, with nature and society. Along this journey, it is of primary importance that they also make sense of their relations with the images.

Which images do we store in our memory, and what can they generate? Which are the neurological mechanisms of vision? How do you build a discourse through images, in reciprocity with the surroundings? These are some of the questions we paid attention to during the photography workshop, both in the collective and in the individual sessions.

The COVID-19 constrictions have undoubtedly weighed on what meaning could be generated by these gazes, but only insofar as it hasn't been possible to picture the sea, merely two hundred meters away from the main gate of Stairway Foundation. Far from being a major disturbance, though, this has perhaps even further strengthened searches and gazes that tell about distance, presence and the infinite... making even more manifest the notion that photographic images are not reality but a representation of it.

Besides nature reminding everywhere in the world its very own specificity, made also of viruses, there is an event to celebrate: thirty years of Stairway.

I have been here for three months, I am part of the celebration, invited to participate just like the children who have been living here for nine months. This is a place of the soul before being a physical place. How do you describe Stairway then?

A simple question, asked to each of the workshop's participants: which

is your favourite place in Stairway? The answers came through intuition, proximity and by chance. It wasn't important to give them in any specific order. All were useful to take a few steps towards a destination, talk while going there, and explore once we got there. Exploring visions, observing with the pleasure of discovering one's self besides the place, a way of inhabiting, a disposition to listening.

Habit, even the best of habits, makes us "blind", accustomed; it leads us to inhabit without looking nor paying attention. A cloud passing by today and that will never pass by with the same shape. A flower, many flowers.

A theatre and a bakery, a globe, a net, a border and a guitar, and much else. Everything these images present has a measure different from the copy. No two hearts are the same; each soul is here for itself and for everybody, gathered in an open stay of presence inside and around Stairway.
